

## Revocation of a East Coast Gas System Risk or Threat Notice

Reference: National Gas Rules (NGR), Part 27, Division 4, Exercise of east coast gas system reliability and supply adequacy functions

Under rule 696 of the NGR, AEMO is providing notice of a revocation of the risk or threat notice published at 14:12 AEST 5 March 2024. AEMO considers that the identified risk or threat specified in the notice <u>no</u> <u>longer meets or exceeds</u> the criteria specified in the published ECGS Procedures, namely that:

• the supply of gas in all or part of the east coast gas system may be inadequate to meet demand.

AEMO is required to publish this notice revoking the Risk or Threat Notice as soon as practicable if AEMO considers that the identified risk or threat no longer meets or exceeds the relevant criteria specified in the Notice. AEMO considers:

- (a) The potential risk or threat has ended as: the Queensland Gas Pipeline (QGP) facility operator have advised AEMO of the restoration of the pipeline to its full firm contracted capacity, and AEMO have determined that the supply of gas in all or part of the east coast gas system is adequate to meet demand.
- (b) The risk or threat notice published at 14:12 AEST 5 March 2024 is revoked with effect from the publication of this notice.

AEMO did excercise a direction or trading function and is required to publish a post intervention report in accordance with Rule 698 of the National Gas Rules and the published ECGS Procedures.
